## Organising a Sweepstake

Sweepstake competitions are a really fun and easy way to help raise money for Isabel Hospice. There are a few basic rules that you will need to follow when organising your sweepstake. We've listed them below and you can find out more by visiting the Gambling Commission website here [www.gamblingcommission.gov.uk](http://www.gamblingcommission.gov.uk):

- The entry price must be the same for all participants.
- You need to decide before hosting your competition if the entry money will be split between the winner and Isabel Hospice, or if you are going to have a separate prize provided by you with all entry fees going to the Hospice. Whichever approach you take, participants must be informed before they enter and the host cannot make a profit (ie funds will need to be donated).
- Office sweepstakes can only take place in one office with people in the same premises.
- You must not sell entry on the street or house to house or online.

**Could the losing colleague wear a glittery jacket for a day as a penance, on the Monday after their competitor goes home? You can each donate an extra £1 to the pot as they wear the jacket to meetings or out to lunch.**
